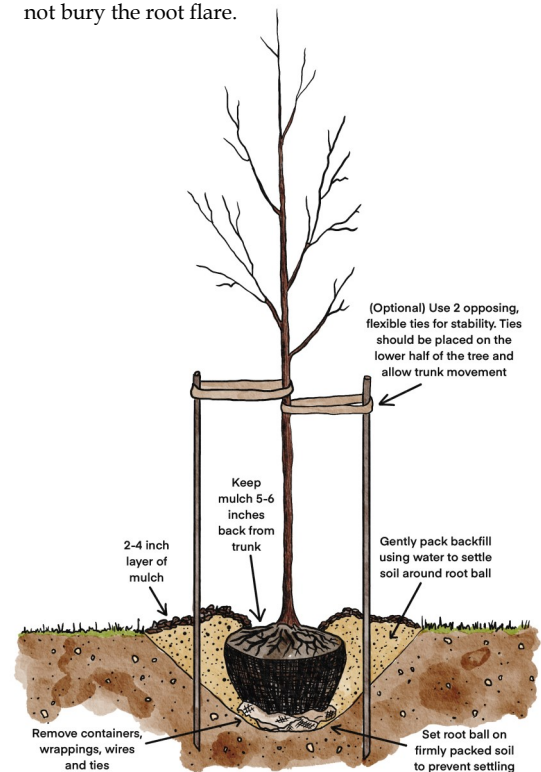

### Planting Instructions:

#1. Dig a saucer-shaped planting hole three times the root ball diameter.

#2. Set the tree in place, removing container and wrappings. The top of the root ball should be 1-2" above grade.

#3. Backfill using water periodically to settle soil. Do not bury the root flare.
